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

International Arctic project launch

The project is funded by a grant from The Research Council of Norway. The new joint project is called URSA MAJOR, which stands for URban Sustainability in Action: Multi-disciplinary Approach through Jointly Organized Research schools.

The project is directed to transforming the economy under the Green Deal and will take 5 years to implement it. URSA facilitates the switch from the use of fossil fuels to renewable energy and raw materials, which will achieve zero net greenhouse gas emissions and zero total pollution of the environment.

The rapid development of new technologies is quickly changing our views on life-long occupation. In this regard, the global labor market is likely to face major transformations. and an important question arises: will robots replace people at their jobs?

A lot of large companies (such as Sberbank) have already begun automating routine business processes. This trend will continue over the next few years across all markets. Jobs, where workers perform repetitive tasks, are likely to die out, such as call center operators, entrylevel accountants, insurance specialists, information input operators, moderators, and lawyers of lower qualification.

For example, many companies use translation software instead of hiring a translator. Already. more than half of the texts within the European Commission are machine translated. This does not mean that translators and interpreters will find themselves out of iob. but the content of their work will change. Translators will have to be versed in computer-assisted translations. parallel corpora development, and memory span translation. Overall, there is no more need to train narrow specialists because they will not have the necessary range of skills to cope successfully with the demands of the labor market.

The skills and knowledge that will still be useful in 5 years lare defined as the competencies of the future. The most important skills are related to communication skills, creative thinking, and decision-making.

At UTMN the skills versatility of a learner is achieved through the new individualized educational trajectories. The main novelty is that students participate in shaping their personal curriculum. They choose their Major and Minor courses, as well as electives, having the freedom to develop a balanced skill set that suits them best. To compare, the old educational model, can be likened to a pattern, where all parameters are always predetermined.


Undoubtedly, flexible adaptable programs are necessary for people of the future, for nobody knows, what the world will look like in 5 to 10 years. By adjusting educational trajectory, every student has the opportunity to become a unique professional highly in-demand in the labor market.



There are still a lot of professions that can't be automated. It involves jobs where a high level of creativity and decision-making abilities is needed. Such as scientists, top managers, cultural figures, top IT specialists, doctors of the highest category, etc.



When one job becomes obsolete, another appears. Right now, there are new developing areas in need of professionals, such as cognitive technologies and algorithmic processing, machine learning, big data, robotics, etc.



Education is changing at all levels. In 4-5 years from the moment of enrolment into the university, the market of professions will change so considerably that the acquired skills and knowledge that students have achieved will already be outdated.

If measures to change the sphere of education are insufficient (or belated) to adapt in the labor market, then education will stop helping people in finding jobs and will cease to be a social lift.

The education system ought to catch up with the demands of companies and challenges of the labor market. It means that everyone will have to learn new things. Lifelong learning and retraining will become a common practice.

Technology is gradually changing the world and the labor market

Big technological changes are not limited to a singular sphere of activity, but they affect entire industries as well.

Quite recently, computers and automated machinery have become so cheap and efficient that in some workplaces it is now effective to use them instead of people. Mechanisms and programs replaced checktaker, security guards, accountants. Even annual reports for Forbes are written by robots!

Universities should move beyond the framework of training personnel for existing industries. Universities' new goal is to support individuals in forming a set of competencies that allow graduates to create new types of businesses, new activities, and new jobs on their own.

Stay curious. Stay one step ahead

Time does not wait for anybody. We will always need to keep up with it. However, there is a chance to change the pace. UTMN anticipates, creates, and manages change in a variety of domains (scientific, technological, environmental, economic, and public). Here are some programs of the future that you can take right now

The future is hard to predict. Most areas of great invention come about unexpectedly. The same goes for changes in the labor market. Professions do not develop according to the forecasts of experts. As a rule, new jobs emerge with the development of new technologies and tools.

According to the HeadHunter research, between 2010 to 2019 the demand for digital field professionals grew by 85%. Some professions are not newly developed but reimagined. They can be called "classical" and are always in demand.

The University of Tyumen offers training at all levels of education: Bachelor, Master, and Postgrad programs. UTMN is also a strong proponent of lifelong learning and offers an array of classes and workshops. We believe that to succeed, professionals will need to develop constantly their skills.





Digital Cultures and Media Production (MR)

The media industry is constantly changing, and therefore it requires versatile professionals who can produce successful media content and foresee change. Graduates will be able to turn out up-to-the-minute media texts and projects, using advanced methods and the latest technologies.





Computer Security (BA)

In years to come, the demand for IT specialists will considerably grow. This program focuses upon the design and implementation of secure computer systems. Students will study the organizational and legal foundations, methods, and technologies for protecting confidential information.






Global Russian Studies (MR)

This program was developed for international students who want to study and teach the Russian language and culture. During your studies, you will work closely with world experts, researching the Russian language, culture, and history in the context of Western Siberia society. This is a joint project of UTMN and Peoples' Friendship University of Russia.







The world faces complicated issues concerning climate and environmental change, such as sustainable agricultural productivity growth decline, soil quality deterioration, and antimicrobial resistance of plant pests. Graduates of the program will be able to modify phytosanitary conditions and prevent potential risks and losses.





Mechatronics and Robotics (BH)

Students will set up and operate mechatronic and robotic systems in automated production. Students work with professional industrial components at the stations of the modular production system FESTO MPS - the leading provider of automation technologies.





Conceptual engineering of oil and gas fields (MR)

Oil and Gas Field Development is one of the most popular fields. This program allows students overlooking high-tech processes, and assessing the economic results and risks of oil and gas projects. The goal was to establish Tyumen as a socioeconomically stable regional capital, not just as a tourist attraction. The presentation took place in the Tyumen multicenter "Kontora parokhodstva". City administration took part in discussing the brand book and further direction of the project.

The design team wanted to present Tyumen as a stable city, where people can find their own happiness. The new branding reflects Tyumen values — self-improvement, family, and traditions. In addition to the logo itself, the designers also developed branded street signs, signboards, bus stops, and souvenirs.

Some might wonder: "Why does Tyumen need a rebrand?" The answer is very simple. Branding creates a cohesive theme across the city. It is a symbol of union. The new design will bridge the gap between the old and the new city.




Several studies have shown the direct link between the learning environment quality and students' success. Several factors can affect learning ability, including setting, placement, light, noise, and even colour.

Our new best educational building are constructed to encourage students to develop better habits, help them shift between areas seamlessly, and feel comfortable everywhere inside the buildings.

Don't get us wrong. History matters too. The important historical parts of UTMN will always be cherished and cared for. However, some classrooms in old buildings, and even buildings themselves, can't be used for effective learning, as they lack a lot of educational facilities among them charging docs, interactive boards, or Wi-Fi excess.

We want to construct educational buildings that are progressive, accessible, learner-friendly and comfortable for our students, faculty, and staff. A transformation has to happen to suit our vision.



Previously the classroom was designed to fit a certain mode of interaction between students and teachers, i.e. to encourage one-way communication, where the professor is instructing the students and no conversation occurs.

The education system at UTMN has long progressed since. Nowadays dialogue, feedback, teamwork shape its core. Modern classrooms should be easily transformed to meet the shifting goals of the group. It goes without saying that organizing remote learning processes within the classroom is a top priority.

In order to meet these requirements, UTMN decided to reimagine its leaning spaces completely.

New Space


On the average, a student spends between five to eight hours on campus. The new campus focuses on developing areas for study and leisure inside the educational buildings.







On the ground floor of the complex, there is a spacious cafe and a gym. The gym has a separate studio for individual training and a cardio zone with modern fitness equipment

When I applied, the admissions office told us about the new system. At that time, I had no idea how IET will influence my studies. In the end, through IET I easily change majors - from Chemistry to Journalism.

Why did you quit your program?

Well, I've studied for a month and realized that it wasn't for me. So, I decided to switch majors. I knew I wanted to study either psychology or journalism. Eventually, a tutor helped me, and I chose journalism.

Tell us about your experience with a tutor.

I signed up for a group meeting with my assigned tutor - Valya. When we met, I told her that I plan to switch programs. After that, Valya invited me for an individual consultation.

During the consultation, we examined my situation; Valya guided me through the decision-making process. A tutor will never tell you what to do. Tutors help you develop a clear vision of your future, set goals, and take action.



Do you think IET is the future of education?
Or just an experiment?

I started thinking about what is IET only recently. I used to take it for granted because I never studied with another system. When I choose main courses, it feels like an experiment: you have to constantly make decisions that will affect the next six months of your life. It is a lot of responsibility. For example, if you've missed a deadline and can't enroll in the course, you'll have to make a new choice. This is how I learned to be more adaptable and have a backup plan. Now I always have two options, even three. And if I can't sign up for a certain elective, I revise my entire trajectory. I created a spreadsheet in Word where I record everything.

What are the downsides? What does not suit you personally?

There is always room to grow. I believe that there should be a set date when students can choose their electives. It should be done on weekends when there are no classes. Secondly, there needs to be a trial period. Before enrolling in a class, I would like to see the professor and listen to an introductory lecture.

On the bright side, IET is good for those who love variety — there are hundreds of electives to choose from. Everyone can find something. Sometimes I scroll through the electives list, and there are some funny ones, or just boring ones, for me at least. There was one class for law and I thought: "Who be interested in this? Surely no one will sign up for this course." But the class got full in minutes!

Do you think students who study with classic programs and IET differ?

I find it difficult to answer this question since I don't know any students outside of UTMN.

But I suppose that they have fewer acquaintances. We always have opportunities to meet new people through electives. Journalists, educators, chemists, psychologists, historians - all study together. IET allows you to communicate with people from different spheres and it helps to form your own views. For example, I attend the «Human Ecology» elective. We watch films on human ecology, after which we have a discussion. Each student points out something different. As a result, we all get to express our opinions and expand our worldview.

What is teamwork like during study projects?

The team includes from three to six members. This mode is more challenging than individual work. Once, I was sorted into a group, where a person was my complete opposite. On the one hand, it helped to have a second opinion, but on the other hand, we had conflicts, due to which at some point we could not continue working. And I also realized that it is better not to do joint projects with friends.

Hre students using the IET wrong?

IET provides a choice. And some students are still stuck on the idea that they can't choose anything outside their Major. Therefore, they are limiting their choices. In my opinion, there is nothing wrong to study Chemistry and take a course in public speaking. Students should prioritize being versatile, sociable, and adaptable more.

What is the general attitude of students towards IET?


Many students don't have a clear answer. Because many do not think about what an IET is. Everyone takes it for granted.

What is the next step for IET?

As I said earlier – trial runs. Professors need to arrange a preliminary presentation of their subjects. In addition, preferential treatment should be discouraged. Better performing students have an easier time choosing electives. I'm not sure how the faculty will address this, but these changes need to happen.

ECO-FRIENDLY STANDS FOR ENVIRONMENTALLY FRIENDLY

This concept refers to products that cause minimal harm to the environment





Kristina Shelemekha, the head of the volunteer association "Krugovorot" and the founder of the ecomarket "Paketa.net" told us how to start your eco-friendly journey



Kristina opened her zero waste shop in 2017. The concept is simple — almost all goods are sold without packaging. Zero waste is a conscious avoidance of waste. To solve the problem of the increasing amount of waste all over the world, it is necessary to reduce the amount of it. Imagine how the total amount of waste will decrease if even a few people chose to reduce their plastic products consumption.

Start your ecoawareness in a proper way. Ask yourself: why do you want to be green?

The eco-movement is gaining a great deal of interest, and it is quickly becoming a new glorified way of consumption. People throw themselves at new trends but fail to do it to the point. They don't let the change happen gradually.

Throughout the years I've heard some truly bizarre motivations to go green. For example, getting famous. Such approach is popular among volunteers. They plan to volunteer, then gain traction, start giving interviews, come up with an eco-project, dramatically change the world and solve every problem once and for all. It turns out that the world does not change at the snap of a finger, and interviews are quite tedious and painstaking work. Therefore, first, we need to answer the question "What is the purpose of going green?"

Russia has a lot of catching up to do.

For me, sustainable ethical consumption was always the way to go. At first, I thought there was something wrong with me. For example, when I had to buy an extra bottle of perfume or a bottle of nail polish, or new shoes, I felt a mental resistance.

I always thought I was wired for doing that and brushed off my feelings for the first twenty years of my life. Only after I learned what responsible consumption is. It turns out that minimalism, conscious consumption, zero waste – are normal useful practices, that are quite common in America and Europe. It turns out that in Russia we are experiencing a long and slow process of catching up to this.

Think over your goal. Otherwise, you will quickly lose interest.

It is necessary to understand that by introducing eco-practices, we are not acting for the benefit of nature, because it will recover in any case. Even if some cataclysm will simply erase us from the face of the Earth nature will do just fine. Therefore, it is not quite about protecting the planet, but about the survival of humankind, keeping up the quality of life, and the preservation of the population.

Change starts from within.

It's vital to understand that the planet is overpopulated — there are too many people, given the current consumption volumes. Therefore, we have few options — either strict population control will be introduced, or we will cut consumption to maintain the standard of living.

Perhaps you expected me to say: well, first you need to buy eco-bags, then start sorting and then everything will be fine. But it doesn't work like that. Change starts within, no matter where you live.

I want to be a responsible person and see my country develop and mature. So I start the change with myself, letting the environment around me change on its own time. I find opportunities to sort waste and use less packaging. I always try to make a difference and use all the opportunities that I can find in the city.

There are enough chances to become a real eco-friendly consumer in Tyumen. You can hand over waste for recycling at the Separate Waste Collection Station "Sortirovochnaya", buy food and cosmetics at the Paketa.net, Drevo Zhizni, and Brusnika eco-markets. "Chistaya Polza" shop carries packaging-free cleaning supplies. New clothes can be purchased at second-hand stores, old ones can be donated or recycled.


